◆ Adoption of the Agenda and Minutes of Board Meeting 2/2017 (p.4)

The minutes of the 2017 2nd Board Meeting were approved.

1. Models and Roles of Member Secretariats (p.21)

Item 1: Membership Update (p.21)

• IS introduced Canada and China as being Full Members of UMAP from 2018, and Mongolia as becoming a Full Member after three years absence. The National Secretariats of Sias International University, representing China, and National University of Mongolia, representing Mongolia, stated each country's possible contributions to UMAP. The British Columbia Council for International Education, representing Canada, which could not attend the meeting, sent video messages to the

Board Members to express its gratitude on becoming a member of UMAP, and invited them to APAIE2020 to be hosted by Canada.

- IS gave membership updates on UMAP’s new participating universities.

Forty-one universities (No. 23-63) had signed THE PLEDGE OF AGREEMENT after the 2017 2nd UMAP Board Meeting;

Thirty-one universities newly signed the agreement, and ten universities (No. 25, 29, 38, 39, 41, 45, 46, 49, 51 and 56) renewed the agreement.

- IS encouraged National Secretariats to increase the number of pledged universities in their respective country/territory to expand the UMAP network.

Item 2: List of Universities that have signed the Pledge of Agreement (p.26)

- IS reported that 229 institutions have signed the Pledge of Agreement, of which the IS has copies, although 582 institutions were on the list of the UMAP network received from the former IS. Furthermore, only 162 institutions among the pledged institutions, categorised as “Active Institutions” have participated in Program A&B at least once over the last five years.
- The Chairman pointed out the fact that those 162 Active Universities in Full Member countries/territories are the main users of UMAP, and other institutions need more attention and motivation for them to participate in UMAP programs.

Item 3: New Discussions and Recommendations (p.37)

Dr. Tanioka reported that the Task Force for UMAP’s Organizational Development, which was set up at the last Board Meeting, held three meetings with UMAP member countries/territories plus advisor and observers in February and March. The following proposals were made based on those meetings.

Proposal 1) Possible establishment of subnational secretariat within an UMAP eligible country/territory (p.37)

- Current Situation

There is interest in the UMAP Program at individual universities and organizations on the state administration level in countries such as the United States. However, the absence of a National Secretariat (hereinafter, “NS”) representing the entire country/territory is stalling progress.

- Proposal

Establish an NS representing a state or an individual administrative region (hereinafter, “sub-NS”) with the following three conditions.

Once a sub-NS is established, individual universities within the administrative region can participate in the UMAP Program.

(1) The establishment of a sub-NS is an alternative measure until an NS representing the entire country/territory is established.

(2) A sub-NS shall pay 50% of the annual membership contribution for the country/territory.

(3) Even in a case where there is more than one sub-NS within a Full Member country/territory, the country/territory will still receive just a single vote in the UMAP Board Meeting.

Proposal 1) and necessary revisions to the UMAP Constitution (adding Note 1 in Attachment 3, and Note 2 in Attachment 4) were approved.

Note 1 in Attachment 3: An administrative region within the countries/territories listed above may represent the region and set up a sub-National Secretariat only when there is no representation for the whole country/territory. Even in a case where there is more than one sub-National Secretariat within a Full Member country/territory, the country/territory has only one vote in a Board Meeting.

Note 2 in Attachment 4: 2. A sub-national secretariat representing an administrative region within a country/territory shall pay 50% of the annual membership contribution for the country/territory.

Proposal 2) Possible participation of individual universities from non-UMAP eligible countries/territories (p.38)

• Current Situation

Some organizations and individual universities outside the Asia Pacific region have shown their interest in collaborating with UMAP. When we turn our eyes to Europe, it can be seen that the Erasmus program has been developing in a way to involve organizations and universities outside Europe. Currently, however, there is no clear way to involve organizations or universities outside the Asia Pacific region in UMAP activities.

- Proposal

In order to increase student mobility in the Asia Pacific region by providing students in the region with more options for studying abroad beyond Asia and the Pacific, and to allow them to achieve a better understanding of the Asia-Pacific region through cooperation with other regions, the International Secretariat proposes to allow individual universities outside the Asia Pacific region (hereinafter, “outside university”) to participate in UMAP Student Exchange Programs. The following conditions should be set by the Board for the participation of an outside university.

- (1) An outside university can be allowed to participate in UMAP activities only with the approval of the UMAP Board by a majority vote.
- (2) Outside universities are required to pay a US\$500 annual participation fee.
- (3) Outside universities can exchange students with universities in the UMAP member countries/territories through Programs A, B, C, and UMAP Summer Program, but not with universities outside the Asia Pacific region through UMAP.
- (4) Outside universities cannot apply for Research Net programs.
- (5) Outside universities’ eligibility for scholarship depends on the provider.

The following suggestions and comments were made.

China: Support this proposal when taking into consideration merits such as possible collaborations with institutions in continents outside of Asia and the Pacific region as UMAP is a world organization, and as it will enable true service as exchange partners by not only following the original commitments.

Malaysia: Exchanging students within Asia and the Pacific region is the aim of UMAP as written in the UMAP Constitution. It might be understandable to accept inbound students from outside universities if wished, but it would not be UMAP’s mission to send out students to other regions.

UMAP Ambassador: UMAP was originally established to enhance understandings in Asia and the Pacific region. There is a concern that outside universities may ask for the right to vote or have privileges because they pay the membership fee to use the Network. Discussing how UMAP can

develop collaboration with other international networks such as Erasmus is a more important topic for UMAP's sustainability.

After the discussion, Task Force members were requested to discuss the matter and submit revised proposals at a future board meeting.

2. Reports from Member Countries/Territories (p.57)

IS reported that nine countries/territories, China, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Mexico, Philippine, Taiwan, Thailand and Vietnam, submitted country reports.

The following additional explanation were shared during the meeting..

Japan: Japanese government prepares scholarship opportunity for incoming students through various programs. Government policies of “Japan Revitalization Strategy 2016” aim to increase the employment ratio of international students after graduation from the current 30% to 50%.

China: Chinese government approved 100 scholarship opportunities to UMAP students for program A, B, C from this year. Details will be announced to UMAP members on the UMAP HP.

Malaysia: All the short-term programs offered by Malaysian universities are on the website of the Ministry of Education so that students can easily access the right programs for them.

Thailand: Thailand 4.0 Policy was delivered as a new engine for growth of Thai higher education.

Taiwan: Scholarship for UMAP's Programs A & B, both for outbound and inbound students, are still available this year.

3. UMAP Exchange Programs and UCTS (p.58)

Item 1: Timeline of UMAP Programs (2018-2)

- IS explained the Timeline of UMAP Programs A & B 2018-2, and requested NS to share it with member institutions in their country/territory.

Item 2: Participants of Programs (A&B, C-SSTP) (p.58)

- IS reported that 64 institutions participated in UMAP Programs A & B 2018-1 (p.59)
- IS reported that 76 Super Short Term programs (Program C) were offered from 33 member universities in 9 countries/territories in 2018 (p.65). IS also requested that more internship programs be offered to the UMAP network since student demand has been increasing.
- IS reported that 63 students who participated in Program C received UMAP SSTP Scholarship in 2017, which was the final year of scholarship provision utilizing the UMAP Trust Fund.(p.69).

Item 3: Statistical Data of the UMAP Student Exchange Programs (p.71)

- IS reported the statistical data and indicated the following points.

For Programs A & B:

-The number of exchange students has been increasing while the number of participating universities is decreasing.

-Taiwan, Thailand and Mexico are active senders while Japan, Taiwan and Korea accept the majority of exchange students.

-It is necessary to increase the number of participating institutions and rebuild the USCO system to activate UMAP Exchange Programs.

For Program C:

-The number of participants is decreasing while the number of participating universities has been increasing in 2018.

The following comments were made after the reports.

Korea: Korean member universities asked whether Program C can work with Programs A & B since short-term programs are becoming more popular for current students than semester-long study abroad programs. Some universities in Korean can offer short-term programs tuition-free to internationalize their universities' environments by accepting many international students.

UMAP IS: UMAP's original policy was exchange students for Programs A & B, but there is a need to consider more user-friendly ways to use Program C since student demand for short-term programs are increasing.

Malaysia: Asked destination of Mexican students, and the answer was Japan and Taiwan.

Taiwan: Mexican students can study in Taiwan with the support of scholarships from the Ministry of Education of Taiwan.

After the discussion, the Chairman suggested that the Task Force make proposals at a future Board Meeting to implement different types of short-term programs to meet the latest demands.

Item 4: UMAP Summer Program (p. 90)

- Thailand reported on the Program Overview of UMAP Discovery Camp 2018 and updated the number of applicants: 190 students from 37 universities in 10 countries/territories applied for the program, and 31 students from Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines, Taiwan and Vietnam have been accepted.

Item 5: Re-establishment of USCO Online System (p.91)

- IS reported that a Task Force meeting on the USCO online system has been held via email since the last Board Meeting to decide on the following items.
 - 1) Possible addition of Quota: Quota is only added to Program A, not for Programs B & C.
 - 2) Facilitate to search Field of Study and categories of the field.
 - 3) Requirements for students to submit Study Report for Programs A & B in addition to program C.
 - 4) Require students to input their GPA when they apply for programs.
 - 5) Scholarship information to be inputted by NS.
 - 6) Downloading Database on the system

- IS demonstrated the main functions of the system such as application, online placement and database building. The system is created to have transparency, which means students, coordinators and NS can access necessary information depending on their roles. It can be handed over to the next IS when the IS changes.
- IS informed that there will be a trial period from June to July to develop a users' manual. The members are the NS and institutions in addition to the members of the Task Force for the USCO System.
- IS also informed that the system will be implemented in August and in order to be made available for the 2019 Fall semester Exchange Program, member institutions need to input general information on their institutions in August and register their program outline in October.

Item 6: New Discussions and Recommendations (p.92)

Malaysia: Requested IS to send emails as reminders on the deadlines for each process that needs actions to be taken.

IS: Answered that reminders for each deadline will be sent by the system to the contact persons.

4. Promotion and Marketing (p.46)

Item 1: Implementation Report of Promotional Activities 2017-2018(p.93)

- IS reported on promotional activities from August 2017 to March 2018, and showed a video introducing UMAP programs.
- “UMAP AT A GLANCE” and NewsLetter Vol. 3: IS reported that they were sent in December 2017 to the NS in each country/territory.
- The Chairman encouraged NS to link their networks to UMAP, and also requested NS to inform IS to update their UMAP activities for inclusion in the NewsLetter or for uploading on the UMAP HP.

Item 2: Implementation Plans for 2018 (p.95)

- IS shared information about the participation of UMAP delegates in regional conferences and invited NS to attend international conferences and exhibitions in 2018.
- IS requested NS to promote UMAP with suitable strategies in their respective country/territory using their internal network.
- Malaysia suggested using hashtags “UMAP” and/or “UMAP Discovery Camp” in social media, as a way to share photos among students. Institutions can encourage students and coordinators to do so.
- IS commented that IS will try to use SNS more strategically and more frequently.
- IS also explained that information sessions will be held once the USCO System is established.

Item 3: Domestic Promotional Activities in Member Countries/Territories (p.96)

IS encouraged NS to provide more scholarship opportunities to UMAP programs, as well as approach internal networks in their respective country/territory to let people know about UMAP.

Item 4: New Discussions and Recommendations (p.57)

IS reported on potential programs discussed during the Task Force meetings, which will continue to be discussed at the upcoming meetings to make UMAP programs more attractive (p.51-52).

1) Advanced Placement (AP) program: Invite elite university students from UMAP member country/territory to two- to three-week programs for which students can be certified and receive two credits.

2) Honor program: Invite high school students to two- to three-week programs offered by UMAP member universities for which students can be certified and receive two credits. Students can use the academic credits after entering the university.

3) Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL): A form of teaching which uses Information and Communication Technology (ICT) to connect students in different countries so that they can participate together in projects designed to boost their understanding of various fields or to help them acquire specific skills. It includes pre-departure learning program and follow-up programs after their study abroad, which will enable students to develop their outcomes by using them.

5. Strategic Planning (p.97)

Item 1: Research Net 2016 (Final report in Nov. 2017) (p.97)

- IS informed about the completion of UMAP Research Net 2016. The Evaluation Committee, consisting of Dr. Imran Ho Abdulla, Prof. Hideki Yonekawa and Dr. Angela Yung-Chi Hou, evaluated the final reports submitted at the end of November 2017.
- It was agreed that the reports will be published on the UMAP website.

Item 2: Research Net 2018 (Future Prospect - Plan 2018) (p.100)

- IS explained about the Call for Proposals for UMAP Research Net 2018 and reminded about the following points when applying for the projects.
 - The research team must comprise individuals from two or more pledged institutions from two or more UMAP Full member countries/territories.
 - Research topics need to be related to the aims of UMAP.
 - The payment procedure will be modified to two payments: 80% to be paid after the selection, and the remaining 20% to be paid after submission of the final report.
- It was shared that the Evaluation Committee, consisting of members from Korea, Philippines and Taiwan, will be in charge of selection for the 2018 projects as was decided at the 2nd Board Meeting 2017.

Board approved the Call for Proposals for UMAP Research Net 2018 which will be sent to NS.

Item 3: New Discussions and Recommendations (p.104)

- The Chairman raised a question about how UMAP can better showcase its outcomes and achievements like Erasmus.
- IS emphasized the necessity of promotion and feasibility of UMAP activities, and shared an example of the publication of the International Association of Universities (IAU). The IAU provides opportunities for its members to submit an article on their activities. An article related to UMAP was published in IAU's guidebook in 2017.
- It was agreed that IS would seek opportunities to publish academic reports to promote UMAP.
- Prof. Ashizawa informed that Toyo University has been granted a research fund from the Japanese government to research about UMAP for five years until 2021. This would provide another way to publish academic reports.

6. Finance and Audit (p.105)

Item 1: Final Statement of UMAP General/Trust Funds 2017 (p.105)

- IS reported on the final statement (January 1 - December 31, 2017) for the general fund and trust fund.
- IS explained about the operating costs of the International Secretariat, which is covered by support from MEXT, Japan and from Toyo University. Although the UMAP Constitution says operation costs should be borne by the country hosting IS, it will be important to consider the possibility of sharing the costs by the time the International Secretariat is handed over to another country/region in 2020,
- Taiwan reported that operating cost of IS was \$220,000 per year and the Ministry of Education in Taiwan supported IS financially. Four fulltime staff worked only for UMAP IS during the period.

- Korea indicated the necessity of sharing more detailed information on the operating cost of IS.
- The Chairman expressed his appreciation to countries/territories hosting/has hosted IS as the running cost of IS is very high.

Item 2: Revisions of Budget for General/Trust Funds 2018 (p.106)

- IS proposed the revised budget for 2018, and the proposal was approved.
- The maintenance fee for the USCO System is covered within the maintenance fee for the website by using the same company. This enables the number of Research Net projects to be increased to up to three as agreed at the last Board Meeting.
- It was discussed that Board Members need to think about the effective usage of General Fund expenditures. Currently URN uses 10% of the total expenditure.
- Korea commented on the impact and implementation of the outcomes of Research Net projects and questioned whether it is worth consuming UMAP's budget or not.
- Japan introduced the original aim of Research Net, which is to encourage academic staff mobility, and mentioned that sharing good practices of teaching and learning in research projects could also be a way of developing UMAP.
- Korea indicated that the number of the projects does not have to be two since it uses 10% of the budget.
- Taiwan suggested that a budget be secured for three projects, but that it would not be necessary to choose three if applications did not meet quality.
- It was agreed that the proposed budget be approved on the condition that the number of Research Net projects would not necessarily have to be three if there were no more than two appropriate projects. The topic of Research Net can be related to developing mobility of faculty members.
- It was also agreed that the Task Force continue to discuss the effective usage of the budget.

Item 3: Future Prospects on UMAP Finance (p.107)

IS shared a simulation of UMAP's scale of contribution for eligible countries/territories based on GDP and per capita figures in 2016, and reported the result that there are countries/territories that would be required to pay more and also there are the countries/territories that would pay less. IS commented that UMAP's sustainable financial structure would not be possible by only updating the scale of contribution without any fundamental improvement of revenue and expenditure structure.

It was agreed that the Task Force will discuss possible ways for UMAP's sustainable financial structure and submit a report at the next board meeting or later.

Item 4: New Discussions and Recommendations (p.109)

None

7. Matters for Consideration/ Approval (p.109)

Item 1: Creation of a Finance and Audit Committee (p.109)

- IS proposed "A resolution for the Finance and Audit Committee" to be set up the Financial and Accounting Committee.
- It was agreed to adopt the proposal, with the members of the committee to be nominated by IS. The Board adopted the proposal and IS will nominate the members of the committee.

Item 2: Setting the Dates and Place of the Next Board Meeting (p.110)

- A temporary agreement was made for the next Board Meeting to be held in Osaka, Japan, on September 24-25, 2018. The venue will be University of Osaka of Commerce.

Item 3: Proposed procedure and schedule for the election of new UMAP Chair (2019-2020) (p.110)

UMAP IS informed that it would solicit candidacy from member countries, and that the next chair will be decided at the 2018 2nd Board Meeting. IS requested NS to inform UMAP IS of self-nomination by the end of June 2018.

If there are two or more self-nomination, IS will circulate an email for secret voting. If there are no self-nomination, IS will inform all NS to nominate other countries/territories suitable to be a chair country.

Other Business for Consideration/Approval (p.110)

IS asked for review of the Term and Acronym and to inform IS by the end of June if there is any revision required.

- IS consulted with Board Members about the venue of the Board Meeting in 2019 since NS in Canada suggested its hosting of the meeting during the BCCIE Summer Conference in June 2019 so that Canadian institutions can learn more about UMAP.
- China also suggested its hosting of the meeting to promote UMAP to Chinese institutions.
- Korea suggested that Board Meeting can be held during APAIE.
- Malaysia reminded that the Constitution says once in the country/territory hosting the UMAP Chair and, in principle, once in the country/territory hosting the UMAP International Secretariat.
- It was agreed that the venue needs to be discussed once the next Chair has been decided.

Item 3: New Discussions and Recommendations

KYRGYZ STATE UNIVERSITY I. ARABAEV

In KSU it. I.Arabaev introduced a multi-level system: bachelor-master.

Educational activity of the University is carried out in 60 directions with a combination of different forms of training:

- Full-time education 4 years;
- Correspondence (distance) training period of 5 and 6 years;
- Master's program - 2 years;
- College;
- Lyceum.

On the orders of the Ministry of Education and Science of the KR in KSU. I.Arabaev created the Educational and Methodological Association in the field of teacher education and the named Higher Educational Institution is the developer of the state standard of higher professional education in the direction of preparation "bachelor" and "master" of pedagogical education.

In 2011, in Italy, rector T. Abdyrakhmanov signed an agreement of the GREAT CHARTER of universities, which can ensure the universality of diplomas issued.

Research activities

Along with the educational process, the university conducts research on humanities and natural disciplines. There are more than 20 training and research laboratories equipped with modern equipment, 30 computer and multimedia classes with access to the global Internet.

Formal name: The Kyrgyz Republic

Location: Kyrgyzstan is located in Central Asia, bordering Kazakhstan to the north, Uzbekistan to the west, Tajikistan to the southwest, and China to the southeast. Most of the country is mountainous, with the Tian Shan range taking up most of the central part of the country. This makes Kyrgyzstan a spectacularly beautiful place for hiking and relaxing in nature. Even though Kyrgyzstan is far from the ocean, the shores of Lake Issyk-Kul make for an ideal beach vacation. The landlocked climate means that summers can be quite hot, averaging around 30 degrees Celsius (86 degrees Fahrenheit) in the cities, making swimming and mountain escapes necessary, while winter brings snow and cooler temperatures (averaging around freezing), perfect for skiing and other winter sports. Visitors can also experience the famous hospitality of Central Asia, and immerse themselves in Kyrgyz culture. The world's longest epic poem, the Epic of Manas, plays a prominent role in Kyrgyz culture, and is featured on many landmarks and monuments.

The Kyrgyz Republic stretches about 900 km from east to west and 410 km from north to south, and is situated between 39°N and 43°N degrees latitude. The total area is almost 200 thousand sq. kilometers.

Capital: Bishkek is the political, economic, and administrative center of Kyrgyzstan, as well as being a place of historical and cultural significance. The city is home to many government offices, diplomatic missions, and representatives of international organizations. Bishkek was founded in 1878, and has been the capital since 1926. Alongside government ministries and embassies are many parks and cafes, as well as museums and shopping centers. As of 2015, around a million people called Bishkek home.

Languages: The main official language is Kyrgyz, though Russian has also been recognized as an official language. Many business and political affairs are carried out in Russian, though Kyrgyz is very widely spoken across the country and is now the language of parliament. Uzbek, though not an official language, is prevalent in the southern part of the country. Kyrgyz is written with a modified Cyrillic alphabet. Students have the option of going to Russian, Kyrgyz, or Uzbek schools.

Kyrgyz is a Turkic language, and is mostly closely related to Kazakh and Karakalpak, and more distantly related to other Turkic languages, like Turkish, Uzbek, Turkmen, and Uighur. Many people in Kyrgyzstan are bilingual or multilingual.

Religion: Roughly 80% of the population is non-denominational Muslim, with another 15% following Russian Orthodoxy, and the rest following other religions. However, religious beliefs are not particularly prevalent in daily life, and instead are part of the culture and are tied to ethnicity and tradition. Religion, particularly Islam, is starting to play a larger role in public and political life, especially as interest grows in religion and spirituality after independence from the atheist Soviet Union. The government of Kyrgyzstan is secular, though it does monitor and impose some restrictions on religious organizations.

Form of Government: Kyrgyzstan is a unitary parliamentary republic.

Governmental Bodies: Kyrgyzstan's parliament is called Jogorku Kenesh, and the chief of state is the president, while the prime minister is the head of the government.

Provinces and Districts: Kyrgyzstan consists of seven provinces and two independent cities with the same status as provinces. The provinces are Batken, Osh, Jalal-Abad, Naryn, Issyk Kul, Chuy, and Talas, and the two cities are Bishkek and Osh.

Currency: The Kyrgyz som (KGS) is the official currency, and it divides into 100 tyiyn. Banknotes in circulation are in denominations of 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, 1000, and 5000 som, while coins are in denominations of 1, 3, 5, and 10 som. Tyiyn are rarely seen and used.

State Symbols: Kyrgyz Flag, Kyrgyz Emblem

Kyrgyz Flag: The flag features a yellow tunduk with 40 rays of sun spiraling around it on a red background. The tunduk is traditionally the circular top portion of a yurt, and symbolizes the home and the universe. The rays of sun represent the 40 tribes of Kyrgyzstan.

Kyrgyz Emblem: The emblem features a hawk beating its wings in front of a panorama of the Tian Shan and a rising sun. The most prominent color is light blue, which traditionally signifies courage and generosity.

History of Kyrgyzstan: The Kyrgyz, a Turkic-speaking people, constitute a slim majority of the multi-ethnic population of Kyrgyzstan. The constitution enshrines Kyrgyz as the country's state language, although Russian continues to be used widely. Kyrgyzstan became part of the Russian Empire in the late 1800s. In 1924 it was incorporated into the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) as an autonomous region, and in 1936 its status was upgraded and it became one of the 15 constituent republics of the USSR, officially called the Kirghiz Soviet Socialist Republic (SSR). The republic was also commonly known as Kirgizia under Soviet rule, and Russians continue to call it that today. Kyrgyzstan became independent from the USSR in 1991. In 1993 the republic ratified its first post-Soviet constitution.

Kyrgyzstan is located at the juncture of two great Central Asian mountain systems (the Tian-Shan and the Pamir). These two systems are geologically separated from each other in southern Kyrgyzstan, between the Alai Mountains of the Tian-Shan and the Trans-Alai Range (Qatorkuhi Pasi Oloy) of the Pamir. The Trans-Alai Range, which is the northernmost part of the Pamirs, forms part of Kyrgyzstan's southern border with Tajikistan. The main ridge of the Tian-Shan extends along Kyrgyzstan's eastern border with China, on a northeastern axis. Victory Peak (known as Pik Pobedy in Russian and Jenish Chokosu in Kyrgyz) is the highest peak in the Tian-Shan system at an elevation of 7,439 m (24,406 ft). Located on the Kyrgyz-China border in northeastern Kyrgyzstan, Victory Peak is also the highest point in Kyrgyzstan and the second highest peak in the former USSR. A series of mountain chains that are part of the Tian-Shan system, including the Alatau ranges, spur off into Kyrgyzstan. Most of these ranges run generally east to west, but the Fergana Mountains in the central portion of the country run southeast to northwest. The Fergana Valley in the west and the Chu Valley in the north are among the few significant lowland areas in Kyrgyzstan.

Rivers and Lakes

The Naryn River, Kyrgyzstan's largest river, originates in the mountains in the northeast and flows westward through the middle of the country. The Naryn then enters the Fergana Valley and crosses into Uzbekistan, where it joins with another river to form the Syr Darya, one of Central Asia's principal rivers. The Chu River, in northern Kyrgyzstan, flows northward into southern Kazakhstan. Yssyk-Kul, the largest lake in Kyrgyzstan and one of the largest mountain lakes in the world, is located at an altitude of 1,607 m (5,273 ft) above sea level in the northeastern portion of the country.

Flora and Fauna

Forests occupy 4 percent of the country's land area. Coniferous trees such as the Tian-Shan white spruce grow along lower valleys and on north-facing mountain slopes. Many rare animal species inhabit the woodlands, including the Tian-Shan bear, the red wolf, and the snow leopard, which are protected by government decree. Other animals in Kyrgyzstan include deer, mountain goats, and mountain sheep. Kyrgyzstan's mountain lakes are an annual refuge for thousands of migrating birds, including the mountain goose and other rare species.

Kyrgyzstan's landscape, blessed and bedevilled by a dramatic range of weather conditions and altitudes, supports an astoundingly rich diversity of plant and animal life. King of the mountains, the graceful, swift snow leopard - packed with muscle and sporting a long tail for balance - is finely honed to survive in snowbound peaks.

Marco Polo sheep, their horns comically coiled, tread the high mountains along with the world's

largest ibex whose horns can reach 60 inches. The Tien Shan brown bear and grey wolves patrol the valleys near Bishkek and Karakol. But the visitor is most likely to see marmots - bundles of fur with shrill shrieks - and, if you're lucky, the giant (Menzbier) marmot which lives only in the Tien Shan.

Kyrgyzstan is renowned for its botanical diversity, with some 400 species exclusive to this country. Varieties of tulip, orchid and wild onion are unusually abundant and alpine plants, such as edelweiss, are the trekker's constant companion. The rare aigul flower grows in the Alai Range. The south boasts globally important forests - including rare types of walnut and pistachio - testament to the untouched wildness of this extraordinary land.

Kyrgyzstan's natural resources include significant deposits of gold and other minerals. Also present are deposits of coal, uranium, mercury, antimony, nepheline, bismuth, lead, and zinc. Exploitable but small reserves of oil and natural gas also exist. The country's fast-flowing rivers provide hydroelectric power. Only 7 percent of the total land area is cultivated.

Climate

The country's climate varies by region. The climate is subtropical in the Fergana Valley and temperate in the northern foothill zone. The lower mountain slopes have a dry continental climate, as they receive hot desert winds from Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan, whereas the highest mountain elevations have a polar climate. In the valleys, the average daily temperature in July is 28° C (82° F). In January daily averages are as low as -14° C (7° F). Conditions are much colder at high elevations, where in July the average daily temperature is 5° C (41° F) and in January, -28° C (-18° F). Precipitation is between 100 and 500 mm (4 and 20 in) in the valleys and from 180 to 1,000 mm (7 to 40 in) in the mountains.

OVIR registration

OVIR is an abbreviation, which stands for the Visa and Registration Department of the Ministry of Internal Affairs. Kyrgyz law currently states that foreign visitors, including travelers, must register with OVIR within three working days of their arrival in the country. However, the government issued an order (No. 213, dated 15/04/03) which decreed that citizens of EU countries, USA, Canada and Australia in the country for up to one month no longer need register.



Money exchange: National currency is the Som = 100 tyin. The Kyrgyz economy is basically cash based and the US dollar is the most widely used foreign currency (the Euro and other currencies are commonly accepted). There are exchanges in all cities and most towns. The general advice is to bring US dollars if possible (new notes, post-1995 if possible; clean and unblemished).

Higher denominations bring better exchange rates but must be in near-mint condition. Cash advances on major credit cards (VISA/MasterCard) are available in several banks in Bishkek with about a 4% commission. Many banks now operate Western Union Money Transfer services.

Commemorating the great Kyrgyz of the past

The village of Kyzyl-Bairak has opened a monument in memory of Atake-baatyr and his great-grandson, Shabdan-baatyr, who did much to unite separate Kyrgyz tribes.

The memorial has been build through donations gathered all over the country. President Akayev's children - daughter Bermet and son Aidar - are the initiators of the monument's construction.

Atake-baatyr stands on a pedestal with a snow leopard at his feet and a scroll of paper in his hands. The statue faces the sun rising from behind the mountains. In Russia in the mid-18th century Atake-baatyr was called the prince of the Kyrgyz tribes. This year marks his 265th birthday.

The road to the memorial is covered with pink sand and has fir trees on both sides. A museum, left of the monument, keeps unique photographs and documents on the history of the Kyrgyz people. Some of these pictures and documents have never before been exhibited.

Item5: Possible Arrangement to Balance Participation in Programs A and C

Background

- Universities in particular countries/territories often have more inbound students than outbound students in Program A. This situation may not be sustainable.
- At the 2018 1st Board Meeting, Korean NS show their interest in linking Program A and Program C in order to balance the inbound students and outbound students.

Proposal

Taking into consideration the related discussion at the third Taskforce Meeting, Taskforce team offers the following proposals in order to reduce imbalance between inbound and outbound students in Program A.

- (1) SSTP scholarship (USD 500 * 30 students) should be resumed from 2019. UMAP IS sets priority period of the application for universities that have more inbound students than outbound students on Program A in the previous year. The budget is derived from the General Fund as well as possible fund from private sector.
- (2) The priority period of application for those universities should be considered in UMAP Summer Program also.
- (3) UMAP IS will continue to study how to encourage more students to study abroad.

(Osaka, XXX Sept) Kansai University launches the Institute for Innovative Global Education (IIGE) platform to nurture students with global career mindsets to plan their own careers as active members of the global workforce of the 21st century.

The IIGE platform is funded Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) and supported by the American Council of Education (ACE) and US Embassy in Tokyo. The IIGE platform is an online and project based exchange program for students in Japan to interact with counterparts in the USA. One of its main goals is to promote exchange between students in Japan and USA to strengthen relations between the two countries. The IIGE is a five year project with MEXT funding of 25,000,000 JPY per year.

"The IIGE platform evolved from the Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) teaching method that I launched at Kansai University nearly four years ago," explains Professor Keiko Ikeda, Vice-Director, Center of International Education at Kansai University and KU Coordinator for Global Network for COIL, State University of New York. "In COIL based teaching we use information and communication technology to connect students at KU with their counterparts in other countries. COIL aims is to encourage students to pursue collaborative projects that are designed to instill wide ranging skills such as management and international communication."

Their COIL Plus program includes short visits abroad for students at partner universities. Notably, one of the strengths of the COIL approach is that students interact 'virtually' via the internet thereby giving thousands of students the opportunity to take part in projects.

"COIL is a cost-efficient way for many students to work on international projects and the

approach overcomes differences in term times and curricula between universities in Japan and the US,” says Ikeda. “At KU approximately 1000 students have participated in the COIL program over four years. It is difficult to envisage so many students taking part in standard exchange programs without taking further actions to encourage them to go abroad. The COIL program is one of such endeavors at KU.”

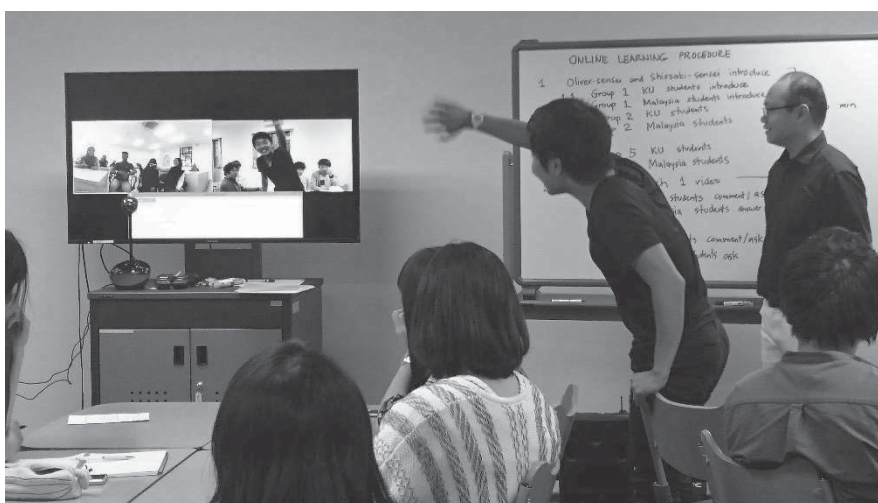

The UMAP Board Resolution for the Finance and Audit Committee Adopted on April 25, 2018

At the UMAP Board Meeting held on this 25th day of April, 2018, the following resolution was duly adopted by the board:

RESOLVED THAT

1. The Board authorizes the creation of the Finance and Audit Committee (hereinafter called "the Committee");
2. The purpose of the Committee is to oversee the accounting and financial reporting processes of UMAP and the audits of UMAP's financial statements;
3. The Committee comprises three or more Full Members selected by the Board. The members of the Committee shall elect a Chairperson amongst themselves;
4. The UMAP International Secretariat shall act as the Secretary of the Committee;
5. The Committee is hereby vested with the following roles and responsibilities:
 - Reviewing and discussing with the UMAP International Secretariat transactions involving UMAP and third parties;
 - Pre-approval or any modification of UMAP's financial statements prior to the Board Meetings;
 - Any other responsibilities as may be assigned by the Board from time to time.
6. The Committee shall meet as often as it determines, but not less frequently than annually;
7. A half of the authorized members shall represent a quorum of the Committee, and if a quorum is present, any action approved by at least a majority of the members present shall represent the valid action of the Committee. The online attendance of the authorized members is allowed if necessary.

UMAP Terms and Acronym

As of September 25th, 2018

<UMAP Organization, Membership and Eligibility >

1. University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific (UMAP):

UMAP is an association of government and non-government representatives of the higher education sector in Asia and the Pacific. The organization is responsible for enhancing cooperation among higher education institutions in the region and increasing mobility of students and staff through exchange programs.

2. UMAP Constitution

The UMAP Constitution is a set of fundamental principles and the embodiment of the governing authority of UMAP. The UMAP Board has sole authority to amend the UMAP Constitution.

3. Eligible Country/Territory:

UMAP membership is currently open to 35 countries/territories in the Asia-Pacific region. The list of eligible countries/territories is stated in Attachment 3 of the UMAP Constitution and shown below:

Australia, Bangladesh, Brunei, Cambodia, Canada, Chile, China, Ecuador, Fiji, Guam, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kazakhstan, (Republic of) Korea, Laos, Macao, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Myanmar, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Peru, Philippines, Reunion Island, Russia, Samoa, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand, Timor-Leste, USA, Vietnam.

Others may be added as eligible Member countries/territories by a majority vote of the UMAP Board.

4. Member County/Territory:

There are two statuses of membership: Full Member and Associate Member. Full Members are those eligible countries/territories that have paid the annual UMAP membership fee. Full Members are expected to participate in the UMAP Board and UMAP Committee Meetings, and they are entitled to participate in the UMAP Exchange Program. Associate Members are those eligible countries/territories that do not pay the annual UMAP membership fee. Associate

Members may attend the UMAP Board Meetings and UMAP Committee Meetings only as observers and cannot participate in UMAP Exchange Programs. Members are required to be represented by their respective governments' higher education departments or ministries, individual universities, university umbrella organizations, or a combination of these. Each Member Country/Territory shall set up a Member Secretariat (National Secretariat) to be the chief point of contact in that country/territory. Individuals are not eligible for membership.

5. UMAP Board:

The UMAP Board is the governing authority of UMAP and is composed of representatives from each of the Full Members of UMAP. The Board shall select the UMAP International Secretariat Host Country/Territory from proposals made by interested Full Members and shall elect a UMAP Chair from Full Members. The elected UMAP Chair shall nominate a Chairperson and inform the UMAP International Secretariat.

6. UMAP Board Meeting:

UMAP Board Meetings shall be held at least twice a year, once in the country/territory of the UMAP Chair and, in principal, once in the country/territory of the UMAP International Secretariat. A quorum of at least 50 percent of Full Members is necessary for the Board to vote on decisions. Each Full Member shall have one vote. In the event of a failure to achieve consensus on an item at a Board Meeting, a simple majority vote of the Full Members present shall determine the issue.

7. UMAP International Secretariat (UMAP IS):

UMAP IS is the acronym for University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific International Secretariat. UMAP IS shall be responsible for the management and administration of the day-to-day operations of UMAP and serve as the liaison with National Secretariats. The Member Country/Territory serving as International Secretariat shall be selected by the Board. The term of International Secretariat shall be five (5) years. The costs of providing the basic infrastructure for the International Secretariat shall be borne by the Full Member Country/Territory serving as the International Secretariat and shall not be represented in the UMAP budget. The Member Country/Territory serving as the International Secretariat shall appoint a Secretary-General to the International Secretariat.

8. UMAP National Secretariat (UMAP NS):

Each UMAP Member Country/Territory needs to establish a UMAP National Secretariat (NS), which represents the country/territory and is responsible for the promotion and development of

UMAP Exchange Programs. Ideally NS should be a governmental institution of higher education (i.e. ministry of education) or work closely with such a governmental organization. In some Member Countries/Territories, a particular university serves as UMAP NS.

The responsibility of UMAP NS is as follows.

- 1) Payment of membership fee and (if necessary) collection of participation fee from Member Universities in the country/territory.
- 2) Provide a list of Member Universities and contacts.
- 3) Promote student exchange programs in the country/territory.
- 4) Promote and oversee Member Universities/Institutions in the country/territory.
- 5) Disseminate information and news from UMAP IS in the country/territory.
- 6) Attend and vote at the UMAP Board Meetings.
- 7) Report annually regarding the situation of student mobility in the country/territory and UMAP activity there.

9. Sub-National Secretariat:

An administrative region within the countries/territories listed in Attachment 3 of the UMAP Constitution may represent the region and set up a Sub-National Secretariat only when there is no representation for the whole country/territory. Even in a case where there is more than one Sub-National Secretariat within a Full Member Country/Territory, the country/territory has only one vote in a Board Meeting.

10. UMAP Committees:

The UMAP Board shall set up special committees as appropriate. No special committee may exercise any authority other than that specifically outlined in the establishing resolution. The members of the Committees are nominated by the UMAP Board.

11. Pledge of Agreement (PoA):

Pledge of Agreement is a simplified name for the Student Exchange Agreement. The formal name is “The Pledge of Agreement on UMAP Multilateral Student Exchange Program between University and UMAP International Secretariat”. The agreement operates between participating higher education institutions, or consortiums of institutions, on the basis of mutual acceptance of the appropriateness of national accreditation determinations, and under the mutual understanding of contents of “The Pledge of Agreement”.

12. Member University/Institution:

A Member University/Institution is an individual university/institution that is located in a UMAP Member Country/Territory and registered as a UMAP Member by the UMAP NS of that country/territory. Each UMAP NS is responsible for confirming whether new members from their respective country/territory can join the UMAP network on the condition that they are officially accredited.

13. Pledged University/Institution:

A Pledged University/Institution is an individual university/institution that has signed the “Pledge of Agreement”. Only Pledged Universities/Institutions of Full Member Countries/Territories are able to participate in UMAP Exchange Programs.

14. Affiliated University/Institution:

An Affiliated University/Institution is an individual university/institution that is located in a Full Member Country/Territory and registered as a UMAP Member by that country/territory’s National Secretariat but hasn’t signed the “The Pledge of Agreement”. By signing the Pledge of Agreement, each Affiliated University/Institution is eligible to participate in UMAP Exchange Programs as Pledged University/Institution.

15. Associate University/Institution:

An Associate University/Institution is an individual university/institution that is located in Associate Member Country/Territory.

16. Participating University/Institution:

A Participating University/Institution is an individual university/institution that has agreed to accept exchange students from other Participating Universities/Institutions by submitting the “Outline of Proposal” for UMAP Exchange Programs in a certain term/semester to UMAP IS. Participating Universities/Institutions may send their exchange students to other Participating Universities/Institutions.

17. Active University/Institution:

An Active University/Institution is an individual university/institution that has been a Participating University/Institution at least once during the most recent five years.

<UMAP Exchange Programs>

18. UMAP Exchange Programs:

UMAP currently offers four programs to undergraduate and postgraduate students. Those are UMAP Multilateral Program, UMAP Bilateral Program, Super-Short Term Program (SSTP) and UMAP Summer Program.

19. Outline of Proposal:

Outline of Proposal is the name of a format which is utilized by Participating Universities/Institutions to offer and explain their programs for exchange students. By submitting an Outline of Proposal to UMAP IS, the university/institution agrees to participate in UMAP Exchange Programs for a certain period of time and accept eligible exchange students from other Participating University/Institution if there are applicants who meet the requirements of the university/institution. And the university/institution is eligible to send their students to other Participating University/Institution.

20. UMAP Multilateral Exchange Program (UME) aka Program A:

The UMAP Multilateral Exchange Program is also called Program A and/or UME. It is a multilateral exchange program among universities/institutions that have signed the “Pledge of Agreement”. In principle, Participating Universities/Institutions send and receive two students per semester on a tuition-waived basis. Students can choose to study either one or two semesters when they apply for programs. UME runs twice a year. One begins in autumn (July to September) and the other begins in spring (January to April). Each program has two application cycles in these periods, during which Pledged Universities/Institutions can participate based on their preferable timeline(s). Therefore UMAP accepts applications of exchange students four times per year.

21. UMAP Bilateral Exchange Program (UBE) aka Program B:

The UMAP Bilateral Exchange Program is also called Program B and/or UBE. It is a bilateral student exchange made between any two UMAP Participating Universities/Institutions that would like to exchange more students than agreed under UMAP Multilateral Exchange Program, or launch special programs between them. The term and condition including tuition waiver/non-waiver need to be discussed and agreed between both parties, and the additional MOU can be signed the universities/institutions if necessary.

If a host university/institution accepts a student nominated by UMAP IS for Program B with tuition waived, the host is also able to treat the student as a participant in Program A and count the result toward the Quota for Outbound Exchange Students.

22. Super-Short Term Program (SSTP) aka Program C:

The Super-Short Term Program is also called Program C and/or USC. It is a short-term (one to eight-week long) program offered by UMAP Participating Universities/Institutions that signed the “Pledge of Agreement”. The study period of SSTP is generally between June and December, and the programs are available in a wide range of disciplines: cultural studies, language proficiency courses, vocational training, entrepreneurship, and more. Universities/institutions offering SSTP may charge or waive tuition fees for students coming from UMAP Member Universities/Institutions in other countries/territories. Universities/Institutions can decide whether they give academic credits to their offered programs or not, but are encouraged to prepare certificates indicating the number of UCTS (normally one credit equal to one UCTS) with program schedules that show participants’ workload inside/outside the classrooms.

Unlike Program A or B, students of Pledged Universities/Institutions other than Participating Universities/Institutions are able to apply for the program.

23. UMAP Summer Program aka UMAP Discovery Camp:

UMAP Summer Program is a special summer program provided by UMAP. The Venue and content of the program differ every year depending on the organizer of the program. It started in 2016 as “UMAP Discovery Camp 2016 (UDC2016)” hosted by the Commission on Higher Education of the Philippines in partnership with De La Salle University, Lyceum of the Philippines University-Bantagas and Ateneo de Manila University. The next UMAP Summer Program was held in Japan in 2017, co-hosted by UMAP Japan National Committee, Niigata University and Toyo University. Below is the list of host countries for UMAP Summer Programs from 2018 to 2020:

- 1) UMAP Summer Program 2018 –Thailand
- 2) UMAP Summer Program 2019 – Taiwan
- 3) UMAP Summer Program 2020 – Malaysia

Eligibility to apply for this program is generally limited to Pledged Universities/Institutions; however, the National Secretariat of the host country/territory has discretion to modify its eligibility requirements and the selection of participants among applicants.

24. UMAP Program Year:

The UMAP Program Year is based on UMAP Multilateral and Bilateral Exchange Program application cycles and doesn’t necessarily follow a calendar year or academic years of

Participating Universities/Institutions. Until April 2018, “Program A&B 2018-1” was an exchange student program starting from autumn 2018 and “Program A&B 2018-2” was one for spring 2019.

After October 2018, the UMAP Program Year will be named based on students’ study period. For example, “Multilateral Exchange for 2018 Autumn Semester”, and “Multilateral Exchange for 2019 Spring Semester”, for which application procedures are announced about one year in advance. Those constitute one year as UMAP offers programs two times per year.

25. SSTP Scholarship:

Until 2017 UMAP provided participants of Program C (Super Short-Term Programs) with SSTP scholarships of up to US\$800 per student. The scholarship was discontinued in 2018. Whether or not it is restarted hasn’t been decided yet. Once that decision has been made, it will be announced on the News section of our website.

26. Quota for Outbound Exchange Students (Quota for OES):

According to the amendment of “Pledge of Agreement”, the UMAP Board decided to introduce the following rule regarding UMAP Multilateral Program: Universities/Institutions that accept more than two exchange students in a given semester on tuition-waived basis (Program A) will be allocated an equal number of additional quotas for outbound exchange students. The quota can be used from the following semester without an expiration date.

27. The First Cycle and Second Cycle:

As stated in the “UMAP Multilateral Exchange Program” section, UMAP offers two programs per year depending on the start of the study period. Each program has two application cycles. Universities/Institutions can choose which they want to participate in each semester. In the case of participating from the first cycle, Participating Universities/Institutions need to review the number of accepted students after the first cycle to decide whether they will keep promoting the program or not. The updated programs are uploaded on the UMAP website together with other programs which start promoting their programs from the second cycle.

28. Home/Host University/Institution Coordinators:

These coordinators are persons who coordinate applications and the acceptance of exchange students in both home and host universities/institutions. They act as representatives of each university/institution for UMAP Exchange Programs and sometimes connect and coordinate between students and faculty of their study.

29. USCO System:

USCO System is the acronym for UMAP Student Connection Online, which will be developed and instituted in 2018. Once the system is established, students and UMAP coordinators of Participating Universities/Institutions will be able to apply through this system, and Host Universities'/Institutions' Coordinators will be able to monitor students' application status and to approve their applications. USCO will also offer statistical data.

30. The UMAP Credit Transfer Scheme (UCTS) :

The UMAP Credit Transfer Scheme (UCTS) was developed to simplify the process of transferring credits earned in overseas exchange programs to the students' home universities. UCTS uses the 60 credit point scale originally developed for the European Credit Transfer Scheme (ECTS). These points can be applied to both trimester-based and semester-based academic years. The UCTS credit point scale facilitates the conversion of credits between different grading systems. It is not intended to supplant the existing credit point scales (or other measures of student workload) used by the host and home universities, nor is it meant to replace universities' regulations and autonomy in terms of assessing students' learning outcomes. 31. UMAP Student Exchange Application Forms:

UMAP Student Exchange Application Forms are used for students who apply to UMAP Exchange Programs. These forms can be used both for incoming and outgoing students. Students are required to fill out items in the form and submit them to their Home University Coordinators, who connect nominated students to UMAP IS. After the introduction of USCO System mentioned above, the use of the UMAP Student Application Forms will be phased out..

32. UMAP Study Plan:

Students as well as each university/institution are encouraged to use this form when they submit their study plan to their host university/institution after their acceptance. You are able to see the form included in UCTS Users' Guide at the UMAP Website (http://umap.org/wp-content/uploads/2017/03/%E3%80%90uploaded-on-website%E3%80%91UCTS_Users_Guide.pdf)

< **Others** >

33. UMAP Research Net (URN):

UMAP Research Net (URN) promotes the mobility of academic faculty, researchers and students through the establishment of research networks—groups of two or more researchers from UMAP Pledged Institutions who share common research interests. URN calls for proposals from research networks. All submitted proposals will be reviewed by an international panel of reviewers, and UMAP will select the proposals based on their significance, timelines, and relevance to the goals of UMAP. Selected research projects will be funded by UMAP and the selection of projects will be performed biennially. Only Pledged Universities/Institutions of Full Member Country/Territory are eligible to apply for URN.

34. UMAP International Conference:

The UMAP International Conference is a conference and/or symposium which should be held for the general aim of UMAP. Based on the UMAP Constitution, the Chairperson of UMAP Board has to convene and preside over it and at least once during the term of Chairmanship. Recently UMAP International Conference has been held successively with the UMAP Board Meeting.

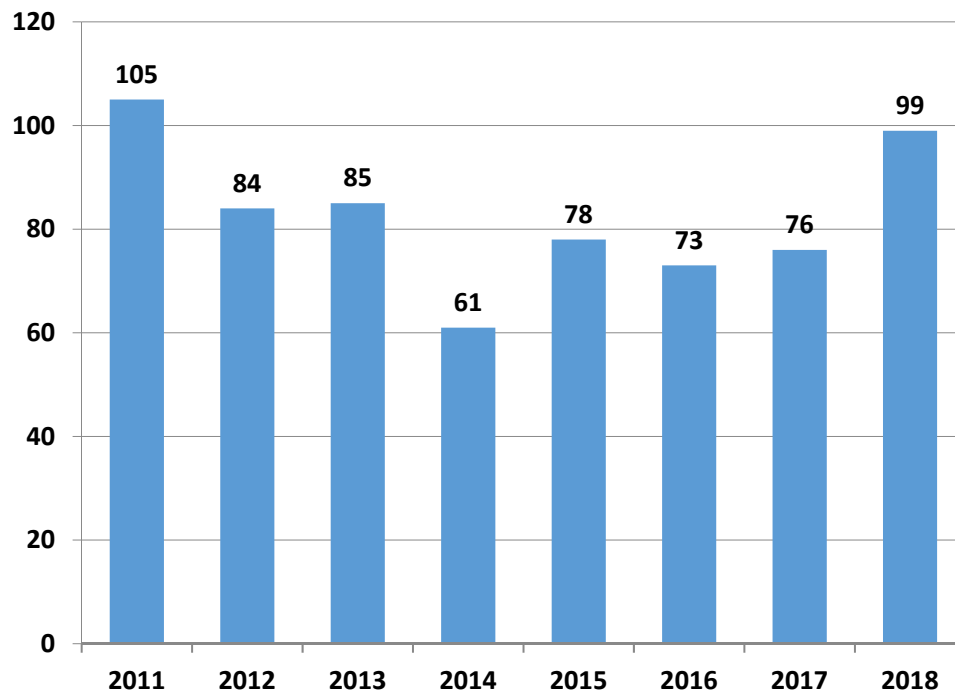

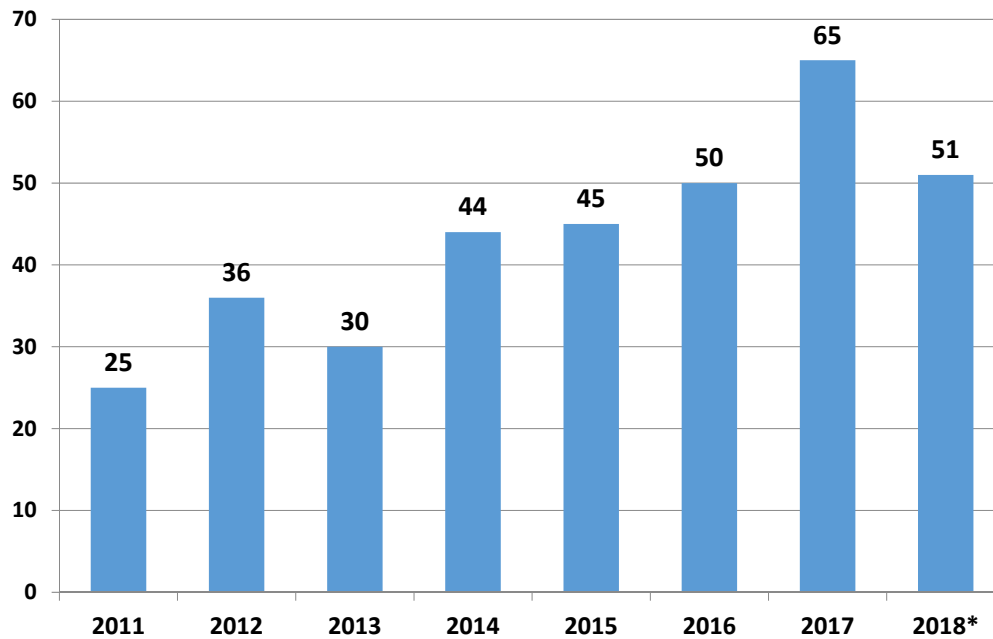

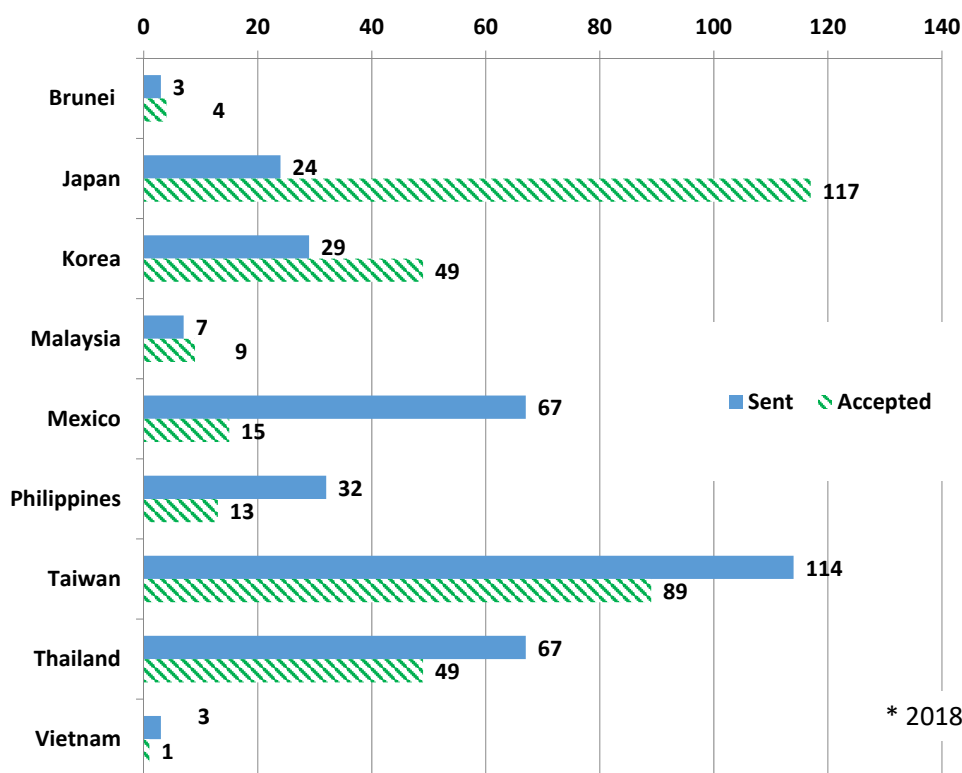
Number of Exchange Students (2011-2018*)

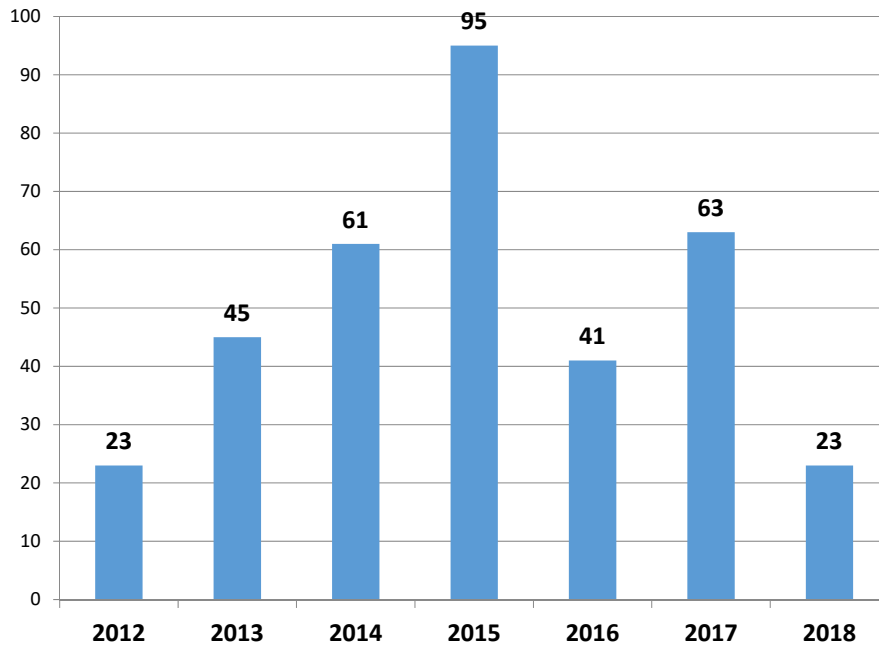

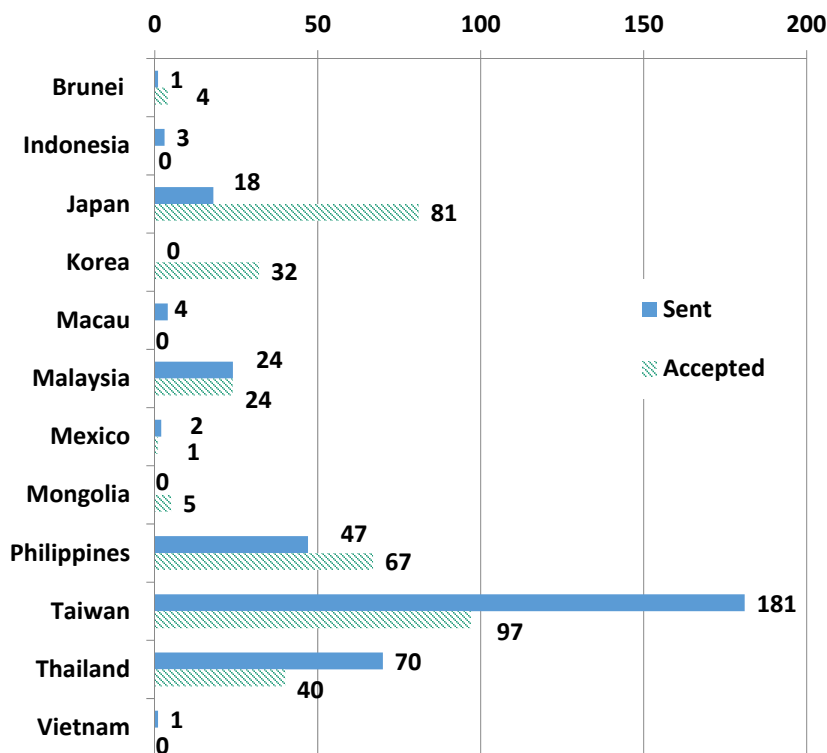

UMAP Constitution

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 The name of the organization is University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific (UMAP).
- 1.2 The organization is an association of government and non-government representatives of the higher education sector in Asia and the Pacific. The organization is responsible for enhancing cooperation among higher education institutions (HEIs) in the region and increasing mobility of students and staff through UMAP exchange programs.
- 1.3 The UMAP Exchange Programs involve the development and implementation of university student and staff exchanges which are consistent with the UMAP principles listed in Attachment 1.
- 1.4 The governing authority of UMAP is the UMAP Board. The UMAP Board is composed of representatives from each of the Full Members of UMAP (see Article IV).
- 1.5 The UMAP International Secretariat administers UMAP (see Article V).
- 1.6 The UMAP National Secretariat is the chief point of contact in a member country/territory (see Article VI).
- 1.7 The UMAP organization structure is shown in Attachment 2.

ARTICLE II AIM, GOAL AND FUNCTIONS

- 2.1 The general aim of UMAP is to achieve a better understanding within each of the countries and territories in the Asia-Pacific region of the cultural, economic and social systems of the other countries and territories in the region through enhanced cooperation among higher education institutions and increased mobility of university students and staff.
- 2.2 The goal of UMAP is to increase the exchange of university students and staff through cooperation among countries/territories of the Asia-Pacific Region.
- 2.3 The objectives of UMAP are:
 - (a) To identify and overcome impediments to university mobility.
 - (b) To promote bilateral, multilateral and consortium arrangements among universities of member countries/territories.
 - (c) To develop and maintain a system for recognition and transfer of credits.
- 2.4 To realize the aim and goals, UMAP will closely collaborate with universities of member countries/territories at their request, in joint projects, programmes and activities on students and staff mobility.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

- 3.1 UMAP Membership is open to those countries/territories listed in Attachment 3. Others may be added as eligible Member countries/territories by a majority vote of the UMAP Board.
- 3.2 There are two statuses of Membership: Full Member and Associate Member.
 - (a) Full Members are those eligible countries/territories that pay an annual contribution as assigned to them based on the formula set out in Attachment 4.
 - (b) Associate Members are any eligible countries/territories that wish to be associated with UMAP.
- 3.3 Full Members are expected to participate in the UMAP Board and UMAP Committee Meetings and are entitled to participate in UMAP Exchange Programs.
- 3.4 Associate Members may participate in the UMAP Board Meetings and UMAP Committee Meetings only as observers and cannot participate in UMAP Exchange Programs.
- 3.5 Any Full Member of UMAP may withdraw from UMAP by notice addressed to the UMAP International Secretariat.
- 3.6 Representation of each member country/territory is determined by that country/territory but must enable effective representation of the national higher education system. Representation may be from the peak body of the universities, consortia of universities, individual universities, government or a combination of these. Individuals are not eligible to be UMAP Members.

ARTICLE IV THE UMAP BOARD

- 4.1 The UMAP Board is composed of all Full Members.
- 4.2 The Board shall determine the policies and the main lines of work for the smooth and effective operation of UMAP.
- 4.3 The Board shall select the UMAP International Secretariat Host Country from proposals made by interested Full Members.
- 4.4 The Board shall oversee the UMAP International Secretariat.
- 4.5 The Board shall receive the reports of the UMAP International Secretariat and approve the program and budget of UMAP.
- 4.6 The Board shall review the Constitution biennially and has sole authority to amend the Constitution.
- 4.7 The Board shall set up special committees as appropriate. No special committee may exercise any authority other than that specifically outlined in the establishing resolution.
- 4.8 The Board shall elect a UMAP Chair from Full Members. The elected member shall nominate a chairperson and inform the UMAP International Secretariat.

- (a) The Chairperson shall be responsible for convening and presiding over all meetings of the UMAP Board and the UMAP International Conference.
 - (b) The Chairperson shall host the Board Meeting once a year and UMAP International Conference once during the term of chairmanship.
 - (c) The costs for hosting UMAP Board Meetings and the UMAP International Conference will be borne by the Full Member country/territory hosting the UMAP Chair.
 - (d) The term of the UMAP Chair shall be for two (2) years.
- 4.9 The Board shall meet at least twice a year, once in the country/territory hosting the UMAP Chair and, in principle, once in the country/territory hosting the UMAP International Secretariat. Other meetings of the UMAP Board shall be determined by the Board.
- 4.10 The presence of at least 50 percent of the Full Members is necessary for the Board to do business. Decisions shall be made by a quorum for the transaction of business. Each Full Member shall have one vote. In the event of a failure to achieve consensus on an item at a Board Meeting, a simple majority vote of the Full Members present shall determine the issue.

ARTICLE V THE INTERNATIONAL SECRETARIAT

- 5.1 The secretariat of the UMAP shall be called "The UMAP International Secretariat" (UMAP IS), hereinafter referred to as the "International Secretariat".
- 5.2 The member country/territory hosting the International Secretariat shall be selected by the Board. The term of hosting the International Secretariat shall be for five (5) years.
- 5.3 The costs of providing the basic infrastructure for the International Secretariat shall be borne by the Full Member country/territory hosting the International Secretariat and shall not be represented in the UMAP budget.
- 5.4 The UMAP International Secretariat shall be responsible for the management and administration of the day-to-day operations of UMAP and serve as the liaison with National Secretariats.
- 5.5 The member country/territory hosting the International Secretariat shall appoint a Secretary-General to the International Secretariat.
- 5.6 The Secretary-General shall prepare the agenda for the Board. The Secretary-General shall submit programs of work to the Board and corresponding budget estimates together with such recommendations as considered desirable.
- 5.7 The Secretary-General shall participate without the right to vote in all meetings of the Board, and of the Committees of UMAP.
- 5.8 The Secretary-General shall prepare and communicate to the National Secretariats and to the Board the Annual Reports of the activities of UMAP. The Board shall determine the period to be covered by these reports.
- 5.9 The General Fund and Trust Fund should be managed by the International Secretariat.

ARTICLE VI
UMAP NATIONAL SECRETARIATS

- 6.1 Each member country/territory shall set up a National Secretariat to be the chief point of contact in that member country/territory.
- 6.2 UMAP National Secretariats shall perform the following functions:
- (a) To be responsible for the promotion and development of the UMAP Exchange Programs within that member country/territory.
 - (b) To cooperate with the International Secretariat and other National Secretariats in matters of common interests.
 - (c) To coordinate UMAP participating universities within that member country/territory.

ARTICLE VII
BUDGET

- 7.1 The budget shall be prepared in U.S. dollars and administered by the Board.
- 7.2 The fiscal year of UMAP shall commence January 1 and conclude December 31.
- 7.3 The Board shall approve and give final effect to the budget and to the apportionment of financial responsibility among the member countries/territories of UMAP.
- 7.4 The budget shall be labeled into 3 categories:
- (a) The General Fund shall include the annual membership contributions from the Full Members. The scale of contributions shall be based on the formula as in Attachment 4 and payable in US dollars.

The General Fund shall be used to support the activities of UMAP according to the approval by the Board.
 - (b) The Trust Fund shall include the donations from member countries/territories. The donating country may reserve the rights to set up rules and regulations for the expenditure.
 - (c) Extra-budgetary Funds shall include the additional contributions from the members or facilities or other resources for UMAP purposes. Acceptance and use of all such contributions or facilities shall be subject to approval by the Board.
- 7.5 Expenditure in any category shall be confined to the disbursement guidelines as in Attachment 5 and be subject to approval by the Board.

Attachment 1

Principles of the UMAP Exchange Program

1. UMAP programs operate between individual accredited higher education institutions, or consortiums of institutions, on the basis of mutual acceptance of the appropriateness of national accreditation determinations. All public and private higher education institutions located in countries or territories participating in UMAP, and recognized in the participating home country/territory and administrative region as nationally accredited, or as reputable providers of higher education courses, are eligible to participate in UMAP programs.

2. Definition of UMAP participation

2.1 Host and home universities need to ensure credit recognition prior to exchange. Slight change will be allowed after starting class.

2.2 Use of UCTS as a conversion scale for credit is necessary in principle.

2.3 Selection of courses and universities depends on each university.

2.4 Participating universities may include institutions that plan to make use of UCTS for their student exchange and have put it into practice as a pilot project.

3. The Exchange Agreement

3.1 Universities that plan to join UMAP exchange programs are required to sign the "Pledge of Agreement on UMAP Multilateral Student Exchange Program" with the UMAP International Secretariat.

3.2 Most agreements negotiated under UMAP will be bilateral between institutions, but agreements between governments or systems or combinations of parties are also possible.

3.3 For recognition as a UMAP project, an agreement should take proper account of the obligations of home and host institutions.

Home Institutions will:

- Select students and staff to participate
- Approve the study programs, including language courses/training, to be undertaken by participating staff and students
- Recognize work completed overseas for credit towards awards at the home institution
- Determine the level of financial support to be given to participating students and staff
- Provide appropriate preparatory courses for their students and staff prior to their departure

Host Institutions will:

- Provide the agreed study programs for participating staff and students
- Provide appropriate counseling and other support services to participants
- Assist participating students and staff in obtaining accommodations at reasonable costs
- Ensure that appropriate health care arrangements are made for participating staff and students
- Take action with the appropriate authorities in the host country to facilitate the issue of visas and compliance with other entry requirements
- Ensure appropriate access by participating students and staff to libraries, laboratories and similar facilities
- Provide any necessary language training

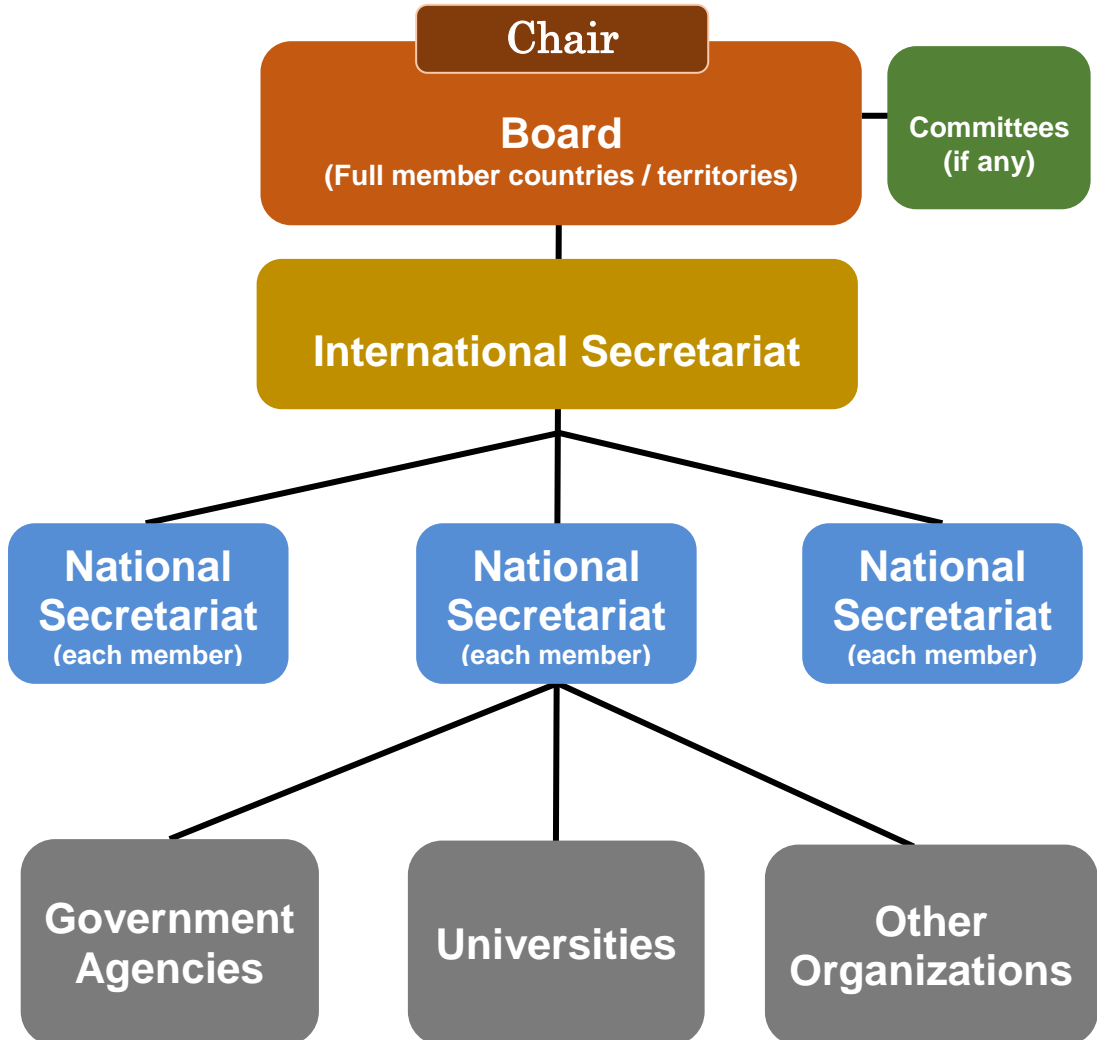
4. Funding Arrangements

4.1 Institutions participating in UMAP need to reach agreement on funding arrangements.

4.2 Matters to be considered may include:

- Whether students in receipt of scholarships, allowances, etc., would be entitled to retain these benefits whilst studying in another country,
- Whether institutions would be able to waive fees for students coming from overseas, on reciprocal terms,
- Whether governments would fund the additional administrative costs that institutions would incur through participation in UMAP; the forms of additional financial support that governments would make available to subsidize the costs of staff and students studying overseas under UMAP; the extent to which private funding may be available to support participation in UMAP; and whether institutions would be able to access development assistance funds to assist participation in UMAP.

Notes

1. The above scale uses 80 percent of GDP and 20 percent of GDP per capita to arrive at a multiple for each member. The resulting list is then grouped into cohorts to arrive at an estimate of the percentage of the total UMAP General Fund to be borne by each member. As economic information is always changing, the scale will periodically be reviewed by the Board to see if adjustments are merited.
2. A sub-national secretariat representing an administrative region within a country/territory shall pay 50% of the annual membership contribution for the country/territory.

Attachment 5

Disbursement Guidelines of UMAP Funds

Grants and incomes received are classified into different funds which are:

(a) **General Fund**

This fund comprises membership fees received from members and interest income from bank deposits.

(b) **Trust Fund**

This fund is from Japan's UMAP Student Support Trust Fund Account and UMAP Scholarship Program Fund Account.

(c) **Extra-Budgetary Funds**

Members and others may make additional contributions, or provide facilities or other resources "in kind", for UMAP purposes.

The natures of the funds to which these grants and incomes pertain are as follows:

- (a) General Fund shall be used in the organization's core operations, which are expenditures according to annual budgets approved by the Board and administrative expenses of the IS for items approved by the Finance and Audit Committee (excluding personnel and infrastructure).
- (b) Trust Fund shall be used for special programs/projects to encourage student mobility upon approval by the Board.
- (c) Extra-Budgetary Funds shall be used upon approval by the Board.
