PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Indonesia is known as an archipelagic country consisting of many large and small islands. Based on data from the Geospatial Information Agency or the Ministry of Maritime and Fisheries Affairs, the government noted that the number of islands in Indonesia is 17,000 in 2021. Thus, Indonesia is rich in biodiversity. The endemic flora and fauna in Indonesia are also huge in number, even in every island or province in Indonesia at least has a unique flora and fauna. In order to learn more about the flora and fauna in Indonesia, Universitas Airlangga initiated a short international program for international students to explore and experience Indonesian nature. The program is called Airlangga Adventure (AIRVENTURE). AIRVENTURE is an annually international program focusing on life science aspect. This program aims to provide knowledge and experience regarding the natural resources in Indonesia.

In collaboration with Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, students will be given some courses about the diversity of flora and fauna in Indonesia. The courses also include the efforts to combat poaching and the destruction of the fauna's natural habitat. Students are also expected to be able to campaign for the movement to love wildlife and increase global awareness of developing issues. Thus, the community will become more aware and care about nature conservation, but does not foreclose their livelihoods.



SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Through AIRVENTURE, participants are expected to be able to observe and explore the protection, preservation, management and restoration of flora and fauna as natural resources that should be taking care for. This program raises a SDG theme, namely “Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss” particularly on this following targets:

- 15.5 Take urgent and significant action to reduce the degradation of natural habitats, halt the loss of biodiversity and, by 2020, protect and prevent the extinction of threatened species
- 15.c Enhance global support for efforts to combat poaching and trafficking of protected species, including by increasing the capacity of local communities to pursue sustainable livelihood opportunities.

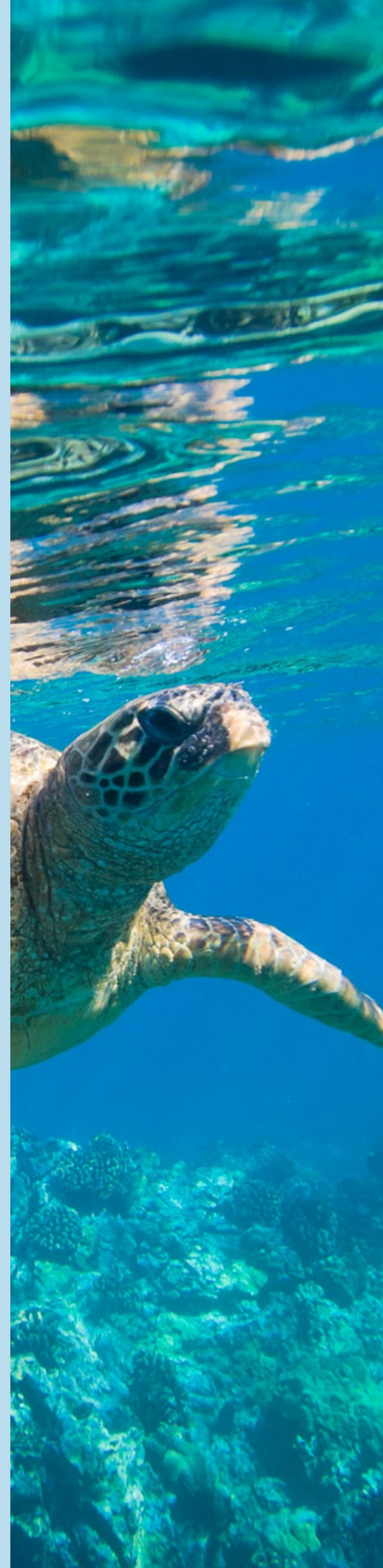
